
Policy Update - RIPE 48

- Policy Development Process being updated
- /21 Minimum Allocation
 - Implemented on 1 Jan
 - 54 /21s allocated to end June
- No consensus for a special assignment policy for TLD DNS operators
- /22 minimum allocation in Africa policy accepted




Registration Services

Corporate Governance

- General Meeting (II) on 24 September
- Members to decide on Charging Scheme 2005.
- Supporting documents published.
 - Activity Planning Support Document
 - Draft Budget 2005
 - Charging Scheme 2005 proposal
- Expected Membership Growth ~11 per cent.
 - Stronger growth this year than expected
- Fees to be reduced by ~10 per cent.
