Summary

Problem Description

- Small ISPs may not have 200 customers

Situation in other RIRs

- This or similar proposals have already been submitted to the rest of the regions
- Some of them don't have already the 200 customers restriction and have some text that allows the "hostmaster" to consider any submission ("reasonable number").

<p>Proposed by JPNIC (option 2)</p>	<p>Be an LIR Not an End Site Plan to make assignments (in two years) Plan to aggregate</p>
