History

- Inception in August, 2004
- Funded by UNDP and organised by SDNP.
- Initial Plan was connecting ISPs through Radio. But didn't really worked out.
- Most of them are now connected through fiber.

History

- 17 ISPs are peering at BDIX
- We couldn't come all together
- Another IX is formed named BSIX
- Fortunately both are peering
- Its all together 21 ISPs are peering at this moment

Traffic

- May 2006
 - Aggregate Traffic at BDIX was 2MBPS Max
 - Total International Capacity was around
200MBPS

Traffic

- September 2007
 - Aggregate Traffic at BDIX is 7MBPS Max
 - Total International Capacity is 800MBPS at this moment and going to be 1.2GBPS by the end of this month.

New Challenges

- Legalization of VoIP was a burning issue for more than 8 years.
- BTRC Declared new VoIP Policy.

New Challenges

- Following 4 licenses are going to be issued:
 - IGW License(3 licenses will be issued for International Voice Traffic.
 - ICX License(2 licenses will be given for Interconnecting IGW/PSTN/Mobile/ISP operators for Voice communication Only
 - IX License(2 license will be given for International Data Traffic along with local Internet Traffic.
 - IP telephony License(for the ISPs)

New Challenges

- IX license?
- IP Telephony license for the ISPs.
