



APNIC fee currency change: Impact analysis



In October 2007, the APNIC Executive Council (RC) announced a change in the APINE fee structure flephysing 1 January 2008, all APNIC fees would be charged in Australian dollars instead of US dollars.


The new ise schedule adopted by the APNEC FIC is based on the old tee act edule. convenies as a rate of 0.7689 US dollars to each Australian dollar. This exchange

rate was the official projected exchange rate for 2007, and was used as the basis for calculating the 2007. APNEC budget.

The reason for this change in earlike currency is the US-dollar's orgoing decline in value, which has been undermining APNIC's revenue base and financial stability. In fact, 2007 was the first yoar is which APAIC operated with a significant deficit budget. As the US dollar continued to docline-during the year, it was clear that changes were weeked to subid reducing APNIC services. or incurring origoing operational losses and excelor of APN/C's CODES (PLANA)

The following diagram (Figure 1) charts the devoluation of the US dollar against the Austablian dollar from 2008 to 2007. while APNIC had absorbed large fluctuators and an overall constantion of the US cellar their 2001 to 2004, the more receiv. divaluation since 2005 has caused greater concern. Looking sheed, it is pestided that this decine in the value of the LS color will continue.





Impact on APNIC income

The doublustion of the US dollar has resulted in a reduction in APARCs income on a parlmamber basis as expressed in Australian stollars, APAIC's operating currency. Figure 2 charts the income received by APNIC from a member in the Small ter from 2009 to present. It is clear from this chart that APMICS. incomp per Small member has been reduced by well ever 40%. since the high point in 2001 (that is, from over \$5,000 to under \$3,000 per Small member per year).

Impost on member fees

Figure 2 also shows the sost of APNIC membership for a Small member in Australia, and illustrates that APVIC membership cools have reduced dramatically over this period. The far right hand and of the curve indicates the now lea in Australian dollars, which is still well being the systemic for the whole period (shown by the set lines.

The rest of the chorts in this article show similar comparisons. fer a selector of currences is the Asia Pacific region. Each chart shows the cost of a Small membership in that currency. the overage cost for the whole poriod, and the new cost after the tee southing mange on 1 January 2008. It is interesting to note that the exchange rate history and behaviour varies significantly acress the region, and it is difficult to generalise the effect on APN/Creambers overall,



Fee structure vote

is a formal vate held in Sectomber 2007, the APNIC membership nanowly rejected a proposal to mulee the tee structure. This preposal had two components:

- 1. Charge APNIC face in Australian delians (at the rate of 0.7990)
- 2. Add an increment of 7% to all fees

During discussions before and after the volo. It was widely apriled that the change to Australian dollars was reasonable, however, the additional increment was not as generally supported.

In making its decision in October, the APNEC EC considered the very close result of the vole and the content of discussions. before concluding that the first component of the proposal was reasonable and should be accepted. The APNIC EC made the decision in line with its responsibility under the APNIC By-laws to data mine APNIO feas.
